Curated by Anne Klontz

Everything is possible in a daydream! One can imagine travelling to unknown universes, pretend to be someone or something else, reenact the past or create possible futures. Daydreams are personal, a safe space to nurture one's identity as well as an emotional and intellectual space for problem solving and creative thinking. Without daydreaming, the novels, music, films and art that we admire would not exist and our lives would be very bleak. As André Breton writes in the First Manifesto of Surrealism, "To reduce the imagination to a state of slavery – even though it would mean the elimination of what is commonly called happiness – is to betray all sense of absolute justice within oneself."

Daydream Believer is a lighthearted, cheerfully optimistic exhibition encouraging imagination and fun, presenting works by 12 artists:

Amy Worrall, Anna Harström, Carl Lindström, Ellen Ljungqvist,
Filippa Nilsson Kallhed, Kreetta Järvenpää, Richard Krantz, Sara Lundkvist,
Susanne Fagerlund, Tove Mauritzson, Fanny Ollas and Paula Pääjjönen.

Anne Klontz is a curator and Head of Exhibitions at Konstfack University of Arts, Crafts and Design in Sweden. She was curator of the 2022 theme exhibition The Hands That Unravel the Sweater for The Norwegian Association of Arts and Crafts and the North Norwegian Arts Centre in Lofoten. Klontz curated the group exhibition 2084 at the Cable Factory in Finland (2020), and she was Assistant Curator of Momentum10, The Emotional Exhibition in Moss, Norway (2019).

History

Takeaway offers a selection of works by 40+ contemporary artists and designers working within a wide range of materials, techniques and artistic expressions. Their work gives an insight into what is going on today in the creative sphere and reflects the importance of the sense of tactility and material research. Takeaway, initiated in November 2020 by Galleri Duerr in collaboration with Seart, premiered with an open call to emerging artists, designers and craftsmen as a pop-up in the gallery room. Our way to support, promote and boost the arts and artists during the pandemic years. Today, the Takeaway concept continues to grow and develop with new and interesting collaborations, among them UU Market in Finland, as well as art institutions throughout Sweden.



AMY WORRALL

Amy Worrall (b. 1989, UK) makes art that caricaturizes the concept of (her) personal image and surroundings. She is fascinated by the stereotype of Brits abroad and how she perpetuates that (by being one of them). Creating quasi self-portraits of joy, mania & awkwardness. Worrall's work is essentially a weird, skewed vision of her own reality. Consuming huge amounts of pop culture, digesting it & spewing it out as these sculptures. At first glance the saturated colours & cool attitude stand out, a closer inspection reveals a more reflective and critical tone.

Amy is one of the founders of the craft platform dotdotdot, promoting underrepresented and emerging material based art. In 2018 she completed her Master of Craft! at Konstfack, University of Arts, Crafts and Design in Stockholm.

Anna Harström (b. 1993, Sweden) is an artist and ceramicist based in Stockholm and Gotland. Working with ceramics as her main material, Harström focuses on questions about function, non-function, and joy. The works range from large-scale organic sculptures to simple tableware for both private and public spaces. With visual references from movies to classical architecture, her practice is an ongoing process about material and interaction. The organic shapes help create dynamic spaces in contrast to dominant straight lines; the space is your home, the park or a long-lost ruin.

CARL LINDSTRÖM

Carl Lindström (b. 1996) in Stockholm is an artist and furniture designer who often uses domestic materialities, objects and their inherent meanings as a starting point for his exploration, with methods characterized by adhoc and resourcefulness within the limitations of set boundaries. Carl often explores topics such as posthumanism and much of the materials and objects for the sculptures and furniture is found in the city and becomes a psychogeography of a world characterized by consumerism and authoritarianism. Carl is educated at the Royal Institute of Technology with a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering, he is now studying a BFA in Interior Architecture & Furniture Design at Konstfack and has also worked with scenography in film & television.

ELLEN LJUNGQVIST

Ellen Ljungqvist (b. 1990) graduated from Konstfack in 2022 and works with sculptures and reliefs in glass mosaic for public environments.

With hand-cut pieces of mosaic a faceted surface with beautiful light reflections is created. From a distance, the sculptures can be perceived as real, but when you get closer, it's like zooming in on a picture. Suddenly you see all the pieces like pixels. We can observe a visual appearance that alternates between different worlds, where the pixelated figures in glass become frozen moments between the virtual and real world meet.



KREETTA JÄRVENPÄÄ

Kreetta Järvenpää b. 1974 Finland is a Helsinki-based artist who specializes in photographing flowers and plants, creating contemporary floral fantasies inspired by the Dutch golden age. She has an MA degree from the University of Lapland in Rovaniemi, Finland. Järvenpää has been exhibiting her photographs since 2017 and she has been featured in publications such as Rum Ute, Helsingin Sanomat newspaper, Asun magazine and Orlando magazine.

Learning to speak the language of flowers.

Flowers are my materials; they are expressive and shaped by time. Since 2016, I have been making floral arrangements and photographing them to capture every detail into a frame. Everything must be perfect before taking the final shot and I want that my photography doesn't look like a photograph at all. I create an escape window from reality with my camera – a floral fantasy.

When I was in my twenties, I swore I would never work with plants or gardens. I identified flowers and plants with my mother – they were her. When she died 20 years later, I felt a need to work with flowers and abstract painting. Suddenly the door was open to me and I understood what I had inherited. Flowers were left for me to build my own connection to making art.

I love my freedom to create the world I want; reality and time have no meaning to me. I find my meditative space through the beauty of changing and decaying flowers, and in my works they last forever. I choose my flowers carefully and try to work as ecologically as I can. I paint my own backdrops and I construct arrangements at my workspace where I have an orange tree. This tree was grown by my mother from a single orange seed. She bought the orange from the grocery store in 1965.

Now I'm on a journey with my own language of flowers.

Richard Krantz (b. Götene, SE, 1989) holds a BFA from Glasgow School of Art (2014) and an MFA from Konstfack University (2017). His art has been exhibited, amongst others, at Centre for Contemporary Art Glasgow (UK), Ronneby Konsthall (SE), Kalmar Konstmuseum (SE), Galleri CC (SE), Klippans Konsthalk (SE), Gammelgaard arts- and culture center (DK) and the Salvador Museum of Archeology and Ethnology (BR).

He primarily works with ideas regarding language, absurdities, humor and loneliness. Medium wise he makes wood carvings, animations, drawings, installations, sculptures and objects. Once he made a text based work that reads BRONZED SILVERED GOLDEN RETRIEVER.

RICHARD KRANTZ

The work is part of an ongoing series of wood carvings, which all are based on digital sketches quickly drawn up in a simple drawing-app on a smartphone. The low resolution text is then enlarged and its outline is transferred, via a laser cutter, to a sheet of wood. After that the text is carved out, slowly - "pixel by pixel".

The texts themselves are based on banal and simple observations from the everyday, but in using the format of tabloid headlines.

The work has previously been exhibited at Kalmar Konstmuseum (2022), Klippans Konsthall (2022) and Galleri CC, Malmö (2021).



SARA LUNDKVIST

In my artistic practice, I am inspired by magical phenomena, spirituality and science fiction from which I am interested in creating glass objects that mirror desire, hope and dreams. Glass objects that seem to come from another world, from the mystical darkness to all the colors of the rainbow.

My glass sculptures consist of both blown glass and molded glass where, through the possibilities of glass, I question the structures within the craft's traditions and techniques. In my latest work, I have worked with both small objects and larger sizes for spatial installations where I combine and develop techniques to create other expressions than what we normally associate with glass. It can be through creating glass to look like another material or get glass to behave in a way that should not be possible.

In 2015 I was the initiator of the separatist feminine glass group B00M!, from the need to create new arenas for Swedish glass on equal terms. Since the start, we have created different types of discussion platforms, realized exhibitions, public performances, released two publications, built a touring glass furnace and organized workshops with children and youth to be able to try glass blowing in it.

SUSANNE FAGERLUND

Susanne Fagerlund received her master's degree in Fine Art at Valand Academy in 2021. During spring 2023, she is completing a post-master course at the Royal Academy of Arts in Stockholm. As an artist, she works project-based, and human and non-human relationships are always the underlying current. She explored our relationship with nature in her recent projects and used artificial intelligence and several other mediums. Her installations oscillate between digital technologies, video, sound, sculpture and photography.

Since graduating in 2021, she has:

- Received a 1-year work grant from the Konstnärsnämnden
- Had three solo and six group exhibitions, including at Borås Art Museum (duo), Hasselblad Center (group), Galleri KC (solo) and Gothenburg Art Association (solo).
- In 2023, she was selected by the Copenhagen Photo Festival as' Nordic Future Talent' for the organization FUTURE FOUNDATION (co-founded by the European Union's Creative Europe programme).
- During 2023, she has several exhibitions around Sweden (Hasselblad Center, Gothenburg Museum of Natural History, Galleri Thomassen, Sergels torg, etc.) but also in Norway (Møre og Romsdal Kunstsenter) and Denmark (Copenhagen Photo Festival).
- In spring 2023, she collaborates with the Hasselblad Center on a project for the 100th anniversary of Gothenburg's Natural History Museum.

FANNY OLLAS

Fanny Ollas is an artist and designer based in Stockholm, Sweden, working primarily with ceramics. Fanny is interested in art and craft in relation to psychology and the emotional relationship we have with everyday objects around us. In her practice, she uses clay to discover and explore visual storytelling and to give form to different mental states and emotions. She combines the playful qualities of the clay with a handmade expression to create a language that is both cute, humorous and sometimes sad at the same time. She often works with scenography and with spatial installations where the objects interact with each other to create a mood or a story. Her work can be described as entering a surreal fantasy world in the borderland between an innocent fairy tale and a melancholic dystopia; a world in which the viewers are encouraged to discover and create their own stories.

Fanny Ollas graduated with a master's degree in ceramics at Konstfack in the spring of 2018 and has since been active in her studio in Gustavsberg.

PAULA PÄÄKKÖNEN

Assorted Flavours

Glass sculpture series, 2021 Materials: Handblown glass

Paula Pääkkönen is a glassblower and artist, whose series of colourful glass ice creams has been noticed all around the world. Glass is her main material because it's such a challenging element – the glassblowing techniques are an endless source of inspiration for her. As an artist, she is currently working with the theme of childhood, memories and imagination. In her work she is chasing the moment, when common things still have a hint of magic and the proportions of the world may vary, bringing light to darkness, colour to the grey. Pääkkönen uses time consuming glass sculpting techniques to bring life to the sculptures, as she captures the movement of biting, crashing or melting into this fragile, rigid material. The contrasts of glass as hot and cold, malleable and hard, are an important part of her artistic exploration.

Pääkkönen did her BA studies in Design and then studied glassblowing in the famous glassvillage of Nuutajärvi, graduating finally as a glassblower. She is now working as a freelance glassblower, blowing glass for designers and artists producing their work, as well as working on her own art. Her work has been exhibited at the Venice Glass Weeks, in CHART Art & Design Fair in Copenhagen as well as by many galleries in Finland, such as Lokal Helsinki, UU Market and Auran Galleria.
